Jane Hislop has been working in higher education since 2001 as a physiotherapy lecturer at Glasgow Caledonian University, then Queen Margaret University and at Sacramento State University on their Doctoral Physical Therapy Programme. In 2018 Jane led on the development of a new integrated MSc Physiotherapy (pre-registration) programme at Edinburgh Napier University with Occupational Therapy and Social Work.

Currently Jane works as an Academic Coordinator for an MSc in Clinical Education at Edinburgh University Medical School. This role involves delivery of an online, distance learning curriculum; for those involved in undergraduate and post graduate education of health professionals (including qualified doctors, nurses, dentists, pharmacists and allied health professionals). Jane is an external examiner for Nottingham University and Glasgow Caledonian Universities on their MSc Physiotherapy programmes and education representative for the Chartered Society of Physiotherapy in the UK. In addition Jane works part-time in clinical practice within the NHS as the clinical education lead in Musculoskeletal Physiotherapy within NHS Fife Scotland. Jane completed her MSc in Community Health at Edinburgh University and has PhD from Queen Margaret University in Edinburgh. Jane has published and presented at national and international conferences and has a particular interest in pedagogical research.
